

Applications for enrollment in the un-dergraduate program must be submitted

- by July 1, 2025, at 11:59 PM Central European summer time (first deadline)
- by September 5, 2025 until 11:59 PM Central European summer time (second deadline)

#### **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

- Certificate of affiliation with the Croatian people issued by the Central State Office for Croats Abroad (Pantovčak 258, 10000 Zagreb, <u>pisarnica@hrvatiizvanrh.hr</u>, Central State office for Croats Abroad)
- Completion of four-years of high school, this being, the last four years in at least twelve years of schooling
- Readiness to move to Zagreb and attend classes in Croatian

For applicants who meet the above mentioned enrollment requirements, a meeting will be held primarily consisting of a disc-ussion regarding the student's motivation to study and an evaluation of their know-ledge of the Croatian language.

The discussion will take place via a video call or in person at the Faculty of Croatian Studies, Borongajska cesta 83d, Zagreb, Croatia, Europe, between July 2 and 4, 2025 in the first intake period, or between September 11 and 13, 2025, in the second intake period.



#### **ABOUT THE FACULTY**

The Faculty of Croatian Studies at the University of Zagreb was launched in 1992 and obtained the status of a faculty on 10th December 2019. Today, higher education at this faculty takes place within our seven departments:

- Communication Studies
- Croatology (Croatian Culture)
- Demography and the Croatian Diaspora
- History
- Philosophy and Culturology
- Psychology
- Sociology

Research and teaching at the Faculty of Croatian Studies focuses on the interdisci-plinary study of traditional and contempo-rary culture, identity, humanities and social issues related to the Republic of Croatia, the Croatian population and its diaspora. The topics include concepts of culture, politics, migration, intellectual history and reality, public and personal media com-munications, activities of social groups, hu-man experience and behaviour, education and upbringing, language development, and relevant political, cultural, social and demographic issues of national, regional or European interest.

#### WHY STUDY AT THIS FACULTY

- Teaching at the Faculty takes place in smaller groups of students, which enab-les professors to clearly define the focus of their teaching, adapting to the interests and needs of the students while recognising their attitudes.
- Numerous students at the Faculty are involved in extracurricular professional activities including drama groups, stu-dent associations, participation in scien-tific research projects, and work in the media, state institutions and the business sector.
- Only this Faculty has an objective to research and investigate Croatian society, state, space, population, diaspora, culture, and civilisational and cultural heritage within the European and worldwide context, as well as to cultivate Croatian national and cultural identity.



University of Zagreb has signed an agreement with the Central State Office for Croats Abroad. It stipulates the college admittance quotas for Croats outside of Croatia with the aim of returning Croats and Croatian descendants to Croatia. Thus, the Faculty of Croatian Studies reserves a place for the enrollment of 53 students, each year, from the younger generations of Croats outside of Croatia, members of the Croatian diaspora and Croatian minorities. The costs of full-time study are fully subsidized from the State Budget.
